

**REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
DUNCAN COMMON COUNCIL
THURSDAY, OCTOBER 12, 2017, 5:00 PM
DUNCAN TOWN HALL; 506 SE OLD WEST HIGHWAY**

CALL TO ORDER: MAYOR WATERS CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AT 5:03 PM.

ROLL CALL: COUNCILMEMBER DOUG BARLOW, COUNCILMEMBER DEBORAH MENDELSON, COUNCILMEMBER ANNE THURMAN, VICE-MAYOR DENISE ICE, MAYOR BILLY WATERS AND TOWN MANAGER JOHN BASTEEN JR. ARE PRESENT. TOWN ATTORNEY DAVID WARD IS ABSENT. QUORUM PRESENT.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: LED BY MAYOR WATERS.

OPENING PRAYER: LED BY MAYOR WATERS.

1. **CONSENT AGENDA:** COUNCILMEMBER ANNE THURMAN MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE CONSENT AGENDA. COUNCILMEMBER DOUG BARLOW SECONDED. ALL FAVORED. MOTION CARRIED.

2. **CALL TO THE PUBLIC:** THERE WERE NO COMMENTS.

3. **TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT:** MANAGER BASTEEN REPORTED THAT THE ASPHALT CAME IN TO FILL THE POTHOLES AT HUNTER ESTATES. HE SAID THEY USED HOT MIX AND DUG THEM OUT PRETTY GOOD, SO THEY WILL SEE HOW THAT HOLDS. THEY ARE SCHEDULED TO POUR FOR THE LIBRARY LAMPPOSTS NEXT WEEK AND THEN THEY WILL WORK ON THE LAMPPOSTS FROM THE OLD FORD BUILDING DOWN TO WANDA'S. HE ALSO SAID THEY ARE PLANNING TO HAVE A CAR SHOW AT THE END OF OCTOBER AT CENTENNIAL PARK. MAYOR WATERS SAID THE CAR SHOW IS SET FOR SATURDAY, OCTOBER 28TH AT CENTENNIAL PARK. HE SAID HIS GOAL WAS TO COLLECT DONATIONS AND USE THOSE FOR VETERANS DAY. HE SAID HE TALKED TO AN OUTFIT OUT OF GLOBE AND ABOUT 9 OF THOSE GUYS ARE GOING TO BE COMING OVER HERE. HE SAID THE CAR SHOWS ARE GROWING. REGISTRATION STARTS AT 9:30 AM TO 11 AM AND IT WILL LAST UNTIL 2:30 PM. HE WILL TRY TO GET BURGER DEALS FROM THE RESTAURANTS. VICE-MAYOR ICE SAID HOPEFULLY THEY WILL STAY, BECAUSE LATER ON THAT EVENING THEY WILL HAVE A JUNIOR RODEO GOAT ROPING EVENT AT THE FAIRGROUNDS AND THE HARVEST FESTIVAL WILL BE HELD AFTER THAT WITH GAMES FOR THE KIDS. DAMAGE FROM THE WIND INCLUDED TWO POLES SNAPPED UP BY THE CEMETERY, THE SHOP DOORS WERE BLOWN IN, ONE SMALL FUEL TANK BLEW OVER AND IS LAYING ON THE OTHER FUEL TANK. SEVERAL RESIDENTS INSIDE AND OUTSIDE OF TOWN HAD THEIR PORCHES BLOWN OFF, THE COUNTY LITTLE LEAGUE AWNING IS GONE. MANAGER BASTEEN REPORTED THAT THEY HAD WORKED ON THE POTHOLES AT HUNTER ESTATES AND THOSE HAD TO BE REDONE BECAUSE THEY GOT FILLED UP WITH MUD. THE DITCH BY THE CAR WASH WAS FULL OF WATER. MAYOR WATERS

SAID THEY NEED TO TALK TO THE STATE AND SEE IF THEY CAN PUT A COUPLE OF SUBMERSIBLE PUMPS DOWN THERE, JUST IN CASE THE DIKE BREAKS THEY CAN KICK THE PUMPS ON AND PUMP IT OUT. HE SAID THEY DO IT IN THE VALLEY UNDER THE INTERSTATES AND STUFF. HE SAID IF THE STATE IS NOT GOING TO KEEP IT CLEAN, THE TOWN SHOULD PUSH FOR THOSE.

MANAGER BASTEEN ALSO REPORTED THAT HE PICKED UP TWO DOGS FOR THE MONTH AND ONE HAD PARVO, HE SAID IT IS GETTING BETTER WITH THE DOG SITUATION.

4. **GREENLEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:** FIVE (5) MINUTE REPORT ONLY, ANY QUESTIONS CAN BE SENT TO rlunt@co.greenlee.az.us SUPERVISOR LUNT WAS NOT PRESENT.

5. **GREENLEE COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT:** FIVE (5) MINUTE REPORT ONLY, ANY QUESTIONS CAN BE SENT TO tsumner@co.greenlee.az.us: SHERIFF SUMNER REPORTED THAT THEY ARE STILL BUSY DOWN HERE WITH A COUPLE OF BIGGER CASES, ALSO AN EVIDENCE CUSTODIAN WAS HIRED AND THEY HAVE BEEN CLEANING UP THE EVIDENCE LOCKER AND POLICIES ARE BEING UPDATED. HE SAID THE DRUG CASES HAVE SLOWED DOWN A COUPLE. THEY HAVE HAD A LOT MORE ACTIVITY AT THE SCHOOLS, THEY HAVE HAD TRAINING AND WILL HAVE A COUPLE OF DRILLS. A DRUG DOG WAS FULLY FUNDED FROM THE UNITED WAY, BUT THE DOG AND TRAINING WILL NOT COME ALONG UNTIL JANUARY. IN THE MEANTIME, ADOC HAS COME OVER ON A CALL THEY HAD IN CLIFTON AND PETE SANDOVAL AT FMI SECURITY JUST INFORMED HIM THAT THEY CAN USE THE DOG, AT FIRST IN MORENCI SCHOOLS, BUT THEN THEY SAID THEY CAN BRING IT DOWN HERE AS WELL FOR THE MEANTIME. HE SAID PEOPLE WERE COMMENTING ON HOW THE OFFICERS ARE ACTUALLY WORKING AT THE FAIR AND ALSO THE FOOTBALL GAMES. THE CITIZENS AGAINST CRIME MEETINGS HAVE HAD LOW ATTENDANCE OTHER THAN THE INTEREST IN THE CAMERA SYSTEMS, BUT ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 24TH AT HILDA'S THERE WILL BE NO PRESENTATION, THEY WILL BE ALL EARS TO FIND OUT WHAT THE COMMUNITY'S CONCERNS ARE. COUNCILMEMBER BARLOW SAID THE COUNCIL NEEDS TO GO TO THE CRIME WATCH MEETINGS. HE SAID IT IS AMAZING AND HE HAS LEARNED SO MUCH AND THEY MAKE IT INTERESTING.

6. **PLANS FOR BREAKFAST FOR VETERANS DAY CELEBRATION:** ANTONIA MARTINEZ REPORTED THAT SHE WOULD LIKE TO HOST A BREAKFAST BUFFET FOR VETERANS DAY ON SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 11, 2017 FROM 9 AM TO 11 AM AT THE DUNCAN HEIGHTS APARTMENTS CLUB HOUSE. THEY WILL HAVE A SHORT PRESENTATION AND THEY WANT TO DO AN HONORING VETERANS WALL, SO ANY VETERANS SHOULD E-MAIL DUNCAN HEIGHTS AT duncanheights@vimresidential.com OR CALL 359-2480. SHE WANTS A PHOTO TO POST UP ON THE WALL ON THAT DAY.

7. **ADOT PROPOSAL TO CLOSE THE ROAD ABOVE MORENCI:** COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID SHERIFF SUMNER HEARD THIS DIRECTLY AT THE LAST BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' MEETING. HE SAID BILL HARMON ENGINEER FROM ADOT DISCUSSED THE POSSIBILITY OF ADOT CLOSING DOWN US 191 JUST ABOVE MORENCI ALL THE WAY PAST EAGLE CREEK, HE SAID THEY ARE NOT EXACTLY SURE YET. THE SHERIFF SAID HE SPOKE HIGHLY AGAINST IT FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY REASONS, ETC. HE SAID THERE ARE MANY PEOPLE UNHAPPY ABOUT THAT POSSIBILITY. HE SAID IT WAS BASED ON THE FACT THAT IT COST \$5,000 PER MILE TO MAINTAIN FOR ABOUT 80 PEOPLE

WHO WERE USING IT. BILL HARMON SAID HE HAS ABOUT 3 YEARS TO RETIRE AND THAT WILL PROBABLY BE HIS LAST PROJECT TO GET DONE. SHERIFF SUMNER SAID THAT THE SUPERVISORS ALL SPOKE UP AGAINST IT. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID SHE TALKED TO SUPERVISOR LUNT ABOUT IT AND HE SAYS HE THINKS IN THEIR MINDS IT IS A DONE DEAL. HE THINKS THEY HAVE MADE THE DECISION, BUT THEY ARE NOT SAYING SO. SHE SAID SHE PUT IT ON OUR AGENDA, BECAUSE THEY HAVE A LOT OF PEOPLE WHO COME TO DUNCAN SPECIFICALLY TO GO UP THE TRAIL, USUALLY ON MOTORCYCLES.

MAYOR WATERS WANTED TO KNOW WHEN THEY PUT THE STRIP ACROSS THE ROAD TO GET A COUNT OF THE PEOPLE WHO TRAVEL THROUGH THERE. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID THERE IS NO INFORMATION SHEET ABOUT IT AT THIS TIME, BUT SHE WANTS TO CALL THE HEAD OFFICE OF THE STATE OFFICE OF TOURISM AND SEE IF THEY EVEN KNOW ABOUT THIS AND ALL THE DIFFERENT MOTORCYCLE ASSOCIATIONS, ONE FOR EACH MANUFACTURER.

COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID THERE ARE SEVERAL THINGS THEY CAN DO INCLUDING SENDING A LETTER FROM THIS COUNCIL, EXPRESSING HOW IMPORTANT THIS TRAIL IS TO THE LOCAL ECONOMY. SHE SAID SHE HAS CONTACTED OTHERS TO CREATE A FACEBOOK PAGE TO SAVE THE CORONADO TRAIL TO START EDUCATING THE PUBLIC. MAYOR WATERS SAID THEY HAVE TO FIND OUT FIRST IF THIS IS A REAL DEAL. COUNCILMEMBER BARLOW SAID IF IT WAS BROUGHT TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IT IS A PLAN.

SUPERVISOR LUNT SAID HE IS NOT SURE WHERE THE MINE STANDS ON IT, THEY MIGHT BE IN FAVOR OF IT SO THEY CAN START MINING UP THERE. SHERIFF SUMNER SAID THE COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP BROUGHT IT UP TO FMI AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM FMI SAID THEY ARE NOT TAKING A STANCE EITHER WAY. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID SHE CAN DRAFT A LETTER FROM THE COUNCIL TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. SHE SAID SHE WILL CALL BILL HARMON AND GET INFO FROM HIM. SHE CAN PRESENT A DRAFT AT THE NEXT COUNCIL MEETING. MAYOR WATERS WANTED TO MAKE SURE THE WHOLE COUNCIL CAN SEE THE LETTER BEFORE IT GOES OUT. **COUNCILMEMBER ANNE THURMAN MADE A MOTION TO TABLE THIS ITEM UNTIL THE NEXT MEETING. COUNCILMEMBER DOUG BARLOW SECONDED. ALL FAVORED. MOTION CARRIED.**

8. **PLAN A MEETING FOR TOWN PARK VOLUNTEER COMMITMENTS:** COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID THIS IS BUILDING ON OUR CONCERNS ABOUT HAVING TO DEVELOP THE BIRDING TRAIL, BECAUSE TO REALLY MAKE OUR BIRDING TRAIL ATTRACTIVE TO NOT ONLY BIRDERS, THEY NEED TO SECURE THE PART WHERE THE BIRDS DO THE NESTING AND RAISE THEIR YOUNG. IT IS VERY IMPORTANT TO BRING MORE OF THE TOWN ON BOARD WITH THIS PLAN TO REALLY DEVELOP THIS AS A DUNCAN TOWN RIVER PARK FOR FAMILIES AND NOT JUST FOR BIRDERS AND A LOT OF US ARE REALLY HOPING TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT THE PARK ON THE HILL. SHE SUGGESTED THEY PLAN AN EVENT FOR THE PUBLIC WHERE WE INTRODUCE THE PARK ON THE RIVER AND TALK ABOUT WHAT'S GOING ON WITH THE PARK ON THE HILL AND MAKE IT A FUN EVENT WITH HOT DOGS AND PUT SOME PLAN ON A BOARD AND GET SOME IDEAS AND SEE WHO IS WILLING TO BE INVOLVED IN TERMS OF VOLUNTEERING AND SHE WOULD BE VERY HAPPY TO BE THE ORGANIZER AND HAVE THE COUNCIL BEHIND IT. MANAGER BASTEEN ASKED IF SHE IS TALKING ABOUT AN EVENT OR COMMITMENTS. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID SHE IS TALKING ABOUT AN EVENT THAT BRINGS THE PUBLIC IN ON THE DIFFERENT KINDS OF PLANNING WE HAVE BEEN THINKING ABOUT. SHE SAID

THE CUB SCOUTS LOVE THAT TRAIL AND SHE NEEDS TO FOLLOW UP WITH THAT AND GET THEM MORE INVOLVED. SHE SAID IT IS JUST TO GET MORE OF THE COMMUNITY INVOLVED AND TO TALK ABOUT WHAT THEY COULD DO. MANAGER BASTEEN ASKED COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSONH IF SHE KNOWS WHERE THE NESTING GROUNDS ARE AT. SHE SAID YES, IT IS ALL THAT DENSELY VEGETATED AREA DOWN IN THE CORNER WHERE THE TOWN OWNS THE PROPERTY. MANAGER BASTEEN WANTED TO KNOW IF THIS WILL EFFECT THE PIPELINE THAT RUNS THROUGH THERE IF THEY NEED TO WORK ON IT. SHE SAID SHE CAN'T IMAGINE THAT THEY WOULD KEEP THEM FROM WORKING ON THAT. SHE SAID IT IS THE CORNER CLOSEST TO WHERE HE LIVES.

MAYOR WATERS SAID HE THINKS IT WILL BE A GOOD IDEA FOR PEOPLE TO EXPRESS CONCERNS OR IDEAS. COUNCILMEMBER BARLOW SAID RIGHT NOW EVERYONE IS DRIVING DOWN THERE AND DUMPING GARBAGE. MICHELLE SAID THERE ARE SYRINGES ESPECIALLY UNDER THE BRIDGE. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSONH SAID THEY MAY GET SOME SUPPORT TO CLOSE A LITTLE BIT OF IT OFF TO ANY KIND OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC, EXCEPT FOR THE RAILROAD, SO THE NESTING ISN'T DISRUPTED. MANAGER BASTEEN ASKED HOW THEY WILL KEEP PEOPLE OFF IF THEY COME FROM UNDERNEATH THE BRIDGE THE OTHER WAY OR DOWN THE RIVER. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSONH SAID THEY TALKED ABOUT GATING THE ACCESS TO THE DIKE. SHE SAID YOU HAVE SIGNS UP SAYING NO VEHICLES BEYOND THIS POINT THEN THEY KNOW THEY ARE VIOLATING A LOCAL ORDINANCE. MANAGER BASTEEN SAID SO THEN THEY HAVE TO CREATE AN ORDINANCE. MAYOR WATERS SAID THEY SHOULD GET TOGETHER FIRST WITH PUBLIC IMPUT AND THEN GO FROM THERE. MANAGER BASTEEN SAID WHAT HE WAS TRYING TO ASK IS HOW WILL THEY ENFORCE THE ORDINANCE. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSONH SAID THE FIRST STEP IS TO GET MORE PEOPLE INVOLVED. COUNCILMEMBER BARLOW SAID DON'T MAKE IT A MEETING. MAYOR WATERS SAID A PUBLIC GATHERING. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSONH SAID SHE WILL RETURN WITH A PLAN FOR REVIEW NEXT TIME.

9. **LETTER FROM COUNCIL FOR I-10 DIVERSIONS:** COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSONH SAID SHE DRAFTED A LETTER TO THE GOVERNOR AND SHOWED IT TO SUPERVISOR LUNT, BUT HE SAID IT NEEDED TO BE SHORTENED TO ONE PAGE AND SHE WOULD LIKE TO GET IT TO THE COUNCIL BEFORE THE NEXT MEETING. MANAGER BASTEEN SAID TO SEND IT TO HIS E-MAIL. MAYOR WATERS WANTED COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSONH TO EXPLAIN THE LETTER. SHE SAID IT IS A LETTER FROM THE WHOLE COUNCIL COPYING OUR SUPERVISOR, SHERIFF AND TOWN MANAGER MAKING HIM AWARE OF THE KIND OF BURDENS THE I-10 DIVERSION THROUGH DUNCAN HAS BROUGHT AND SPECIFICALLY QUOTING THE SHERIFF ON A NUMBER OF HIS CONCERNS AND ALSO DESCRIBING WHAT IT DOES IN TERMS OF SAFETY ISSUES AND QUALITY OF LIFE ISSUES IN OUR TOWN.

COUNCILMEMBER THURMAN ASKED WHAT SPECIFICALLY THEY ARE ASKING HIM TO DO. ARE THEY REQUESTING HIM TO ACT UPON IT FOR THE STATE TO FIX THE ROADS OR ARE THEY ASKING FOR MORE DPS COVERAGE. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSONH SAID THEY ARE SPECIFICALLY TELLING THE GOVERNOR THAT THIS HIGHWAY IS NOT ENGINEERED AND SERVICED TO BEAR THIS KIND OF TRAFFIC. IF THEY ARE GOING TO CONTINUE DIVERSIONS LIKE THIS, THEN THEY NEED TO DEAL WITH THE FACT THAT THE SHOULDERS AND ROAD SURFACE ARE NOT ADEQUATE AND IF THERE WERE A SERIOUS ACCIDENT WHEN THE TRAFFIC IS CLOGGED BOTH WAYS, NO EMERGENCY VEHICLES WOULD BE ABLE TO GET TO IT. MAYOR WATERS ASKED WHAT THEY ARE SUPPOSED TO

DO RIGHT NOW, CAN YOU IMAGINE AS A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, COULD YOU IMAGINE BEING IN THEIR SHOES TRYING TO SHUT IT DOWN. HE SAID HE HAS BEEN IN MEETINGS IN TUCSON FOR DPS AND NO MATTER WHAT THEY WANT THE ROAD OPEN, THEY WANT THE CAR OFF TO THE SHOULDER OF THE ROAD. SHERIFF SUMNER SAID THERE ARE PLACES WHERE THE TRAFFIC SHUTS DOWN. HE SAID MAYBE THERE IS A POSSIBILITY OF MOVING EAST BOUND TRAFFIC SOUTH AND WEST BOUND TRAFFIC THROUGH HERE, THAT WAY IT IS SPLIT, BUT THAT WON'T HAPPEN BECAUSE THERE ARE BRIDGES THAT WILL CRUMBLE ON THE SOUTH SIDE. HE SAID THEIR ANSWER WAS TO BRING A FRONT END LOADER FROM ADOT AND PUSH THE VEHICLE TO THE SIDE OF THE ROAD, BUT HOW ARE YOU GOING TO GET TO THAT VEHICLE UNLESS YOU PUSH 200 VEHICLES OUT OF THE WAY FIRST. HE SAID THE SHOULDERS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT AND MOST OF THE TIME THERE ARE MARKERS ON THE SIDES OF THE ROAD THAT YOU COULD NOT GET AROUND. MAYOR WATERS SAID IF A SIGN WAS LIT UP ON BOTH SIDES THAT STATED ALL EMERGENCY VEHICLES WILL GO THROUGH THE CENTER OF THE ROAD THAT WOULD HELP.

COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON ASKED THE MAYOR IF HE READ THE LETTER. HE SAID NO. SHE SAID YOU SHOULD READ IT BEFORE YOU COMMENT. MAYOR WATERS SAID HE HAS THE RIGHT TO COMMENT, JUST LIKE SHE DOES. MAYOR WATERS SAID YOU BASICALLY JUST SAID YOU WANT TO SHUT THE ROAD DOWN. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID NO SHE DID NOT. MAYOR WATERS SAID HE DOES NOT WANT TO SIGN THAT LETTER.

SHERIFF SUMNER SAID BASICALLY WHAT NEEDS TO HAPPEN IS THE SHOULDER NEEDS TO BE THE SAME WIDTH AS EACH SIDE OF THE ROAD. THE SHERIFF SAID HE IS OKAY WITH THE ROAD BEING SHUTDOWN AND DIVERTED, BUT IT IS BEING SHUTDOWN MUCH LONGER THAN NECESSARY. HE SAID THERE IS A LACK OF COMMUNICATION BETWEEN ARIZONA AND NEW MEXICO AS TO WHEN THE ROAD SHOULD BE OPENED AGAIN. HE SAID THERE ARE NUMEROUS SITUATIONS AND HE DOES NOT KNOW WHAT THE ANSWER IS, BUT SUPERVISOR LUNT SAID HE SPOKE TO THEM AND THEY SAID THEY DON'T HAVE ANY IDEA ABOUT AN I-10 PROBLEM. HE SAID THERE ARE DEFINITELY SOME PROBLEMS AND THERE IS NOT ONE SOLUTION. HE SAID HIS CONCERN IS AT THE GOVERNOR'S LEVEL OF ARIZONA AND NEW MEXICO THAT THEY ARE NOT AWARE OF AN I-10 ISSUE. HE SAID HE WANTS TO MAKE IT KNOWN THERE ARE PROBLEMS AND THEY NEED TO COME UP WITH SOME SOLUTIONS.

COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON APOLOGIZED, SHE THOUGHT THAT THE MANAGER WOULD DISTRIBUTE THE LETTER TO THE OTHER COUNCILMEMBERS. MANAGER BASTEEN SAID HE NEVER HAS RECEIVED IT. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID SHE SENT IT TO HIM. COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON SAID SHE THOUGHT THEY ALL HAD A COPY OF THE LETTER, SO WHAT SHE WILL DO IS MAKE SURE WHEN SHE REDRAFTS IT THAT THE COUNCIL GETS IT.

TONI MARTINEZ SAID THAT DEALING WITH CORPORATE, SHE KNOWS THEY WANT IT BRIEF AND THEY WANT YOU TO SUGGEST A SOLUTION. **MAYOR BILLY WATERS MADE A MOTION TO TABLE THIS ITEM. VICE-MAYOR DENISE ICE SECONDED. ALL FAVORED. MOTION CARRIED.** MANAGER BASTEEN SHOWED COUNCILMEMBER MENDELSON WHAT HE HAD RECEIVED AND IF HE MISSED IT HE APOLOGIZES.

11. CONSIDERATION OF AGENDA ITEMS FOR THE NEXT MEETING: ADOT PROPOSAL TO CLOSE ROAD ABOVE MORENCI, PLAN A PUBLIC GATHERING FOR THE PARKS, LETTER FROM THE COUNCIL FOR I-10 DIVERSION
